**Independent Living Skills:** Important for independent living, these skills include grocery shopping, scheduling, financial management/budgeting, maintaining a household, etc.

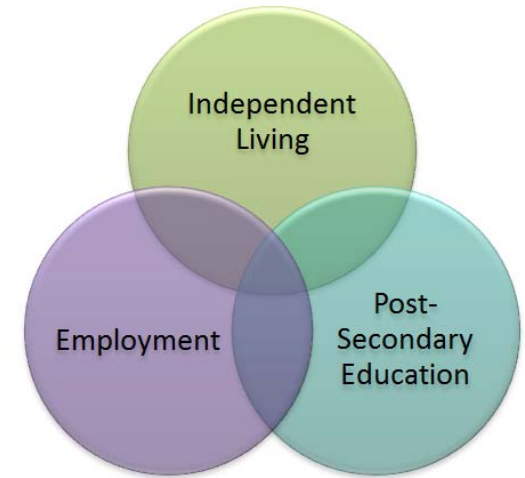
**Social Skills:** Social skills are an important part of independent life. We will work on real-life scenarios and relationship development in a variety of settings.
